Roster: District Entries: Schools in your district will complete the district entry form by September 30th. You can pull the entry forms on your AD login page under the District Host Information section. Players listed on the entry form are the basis for printing a district tournament program. Schools may make substitutions to the roster submitted after the entry deadline, but no more than 20 players can suit up for any district game. Once the tournament begins, no substitutions may be made unless an injury or illness verified by a physician occurs.

* Along with your District Entry would you please email me AD Cell phone number as well as a Coach Cell phone number that will allow me to contact you in case of weather that would force a schedule change the day of the event. Please include your departure time as well.

Game Procedures: Games are scheduled for seven innings with NO time limit. A double-first base is required for your fields. The tie-breaker shall automatically begin in the eighth inning.

Eight, Ten and Twelve-Run Rules: A game shall end after two and one-half innings or three innings when a team is 12 or more runs behind and has completed its turn at bat; or shall end after three and one-half or four innings, when a team is 10 or more runs behind and has completed its turn at bat; or shall end after four and one-half or five innings, when a team is 8 or more runs behind and has completed its turn at bat. These rules apply to regular season, district, and state tournament play.

Determining Home Team:

- The higher seed shall be the home team in all first-round games. The home team for the remaining games shall be decided by a coin flip. The higher seeded team will occupy the 3rd base dugout and the lower seeded team will occupy the 1st base dugout.

Tournament Format- Two team District Final best 2 out of 3.

General Info:

- * Teams can be dropped off on the East side of the complex.
- * Busses can park on the south end of the complex.
- * Field 1 is the Northeast field and Field 4 is the Northwest field.
- * Teams can warm up on the adjoining Fields 2 and 3
- * Parents and Patrons should park on the North or East of the Complex
- * National Anthem will be played or sung at 12:55 p.m.

Covid Restrictions.

2020 NSAA Fall Sub-District, District and Playoff Information

As the fall regular season draws to a close, the NSAA calls upon member schools to host sub-districts, districts, and playoffs for the NSAA. In most activities, the team with the highest seed earns the right to host these events. In other activities, member schools volunteer to host. The health and safety of students, staff, and local communities remain the priority of the NSAA. The NSAA is implementing the following requirements for host schools of all NSAA fall sub-district, district, and playoff contests:

- Participants are permitted to wear face coverings during competition, but not required.
- Coaches and non-active participants are strongly encouraged to wear face coverings.
- Spectators are required to wear face coverings at all times while attending indoor events.
- Spectators are required to wear face coverings at all times while attending outdoor events when physical distancing (6ft) is not possible.
- The host school may establish additional requirements in consultation with local health departments. Any additional requirements implemented by the host school must be the same for all teams, officials, and spectators.

All participating schools and spectators are expected to adhere to these requirements.

Communication, flexibility, and patience will be key in helping to support our high school student participants as they pursue an NSAA State Championship this fall. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.
